

**MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
RIECKER BUILDING**

The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, April 3, 2006 with the following members present:

Dean Cain, Vice-President
Ron Moore, Member

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag. The minutes of the March 27, 2006 meeting were read and approved.

06-163 Motion by Mr. Ron Moore and seconded by Mr. Dean Cain to approve the minutes from March 27, 2006.

The commissioners reported on their activities from the preceding week of March 27, 2006.

Commissioner Moore attended the Area Agency on Aging meeting at the Senior Center on Tuesday. Also on Tuesday, the commissioners attended the Morgan County Planning Commission meeting at the Riecker Complex. Commissioner Moore met with Larry Hivnor from the Ohio Valley Employment Resource office to discuss Workforce Investment Act issues.

On Wednesday, Commissioner Shriver met with the architect for the Health Center Project and Commissioner Cain met with Judge Lowe and Deputy Brad Bond regarding the housing of prisoners.

On Friday, Commissioner Shriver met with a contractor for the Health Center project and Commissioner Cain checked the buses being returned to the county garage by Community Action.

Mr. Jeff Shaner, OSU Extension Office, reported on the Industrial Site Improvement project. Mr. Shaner submitted a proposal from Mays Consulting & Evaluation Services for the Morgan Partnership Growth Complex. The preliminary scope of work was prepared based on findings made during the roof investigation on March 16, 2006. The scope of work was broken out with the estimated costs for each individual building, starting with the building that was identified as the top priority and going down the list to the least priority.

Mr. Shaner reported on the AMS Grant with a maximum award of \$75,000. He is considering applying for this grant with two separate applications, one being through OSU Extension and the other through the commissioners' office. This grant will require

different entities applying. These funds can be used for enhancement and signage for the Farmers' Market and the establishment of an incubator kitchen.

Mr. Shaner reported that the Extension Office held the annual 4-H Kick-Off Day on Saturday April 1, 2006.

Mr. Shaner requested to permission to hold the Farmers' Market in the Commons.

Mr. Stevan Hook, Engineer, reported on the results of the dump truck bid as follows:

Mr. Hook added that after careful review of the specs and bid submittals, he determined that the International Truck & Engine Corp bid submitted by Marietta Truck Sales & Service in the amount of \$167,748.00 is the lowest and best bid. Mr. Hook also recommended to the commissioners that add-ons per the bid forms in the amount of \$3,775.00 per truck be purchased as well.

The commissioners passed the following resolution regarding authorizing participation in the ODOT Cooperative Purchasing Program.

RESOLUTION 06-167

Resolution Authorizing Participation in ODOT Cooperative Purchasing Program

WHEREAS, Section 5513.01 (B) provides the opportunity for State Universities or Colleges, counties, townships, municipal corporations, conservancy districts, township park districts, park districts created under Chapter 1545 ORC, port authorities, regional transit authorities, and county transit boards and local boards of mental retardation and developmental disabilities to participate in contracts of the Ohio Department of Transportation for the purchase of machinery, materials, supplies, or other articles;

NOW THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Morgan County Commissioners:

Section 1. That the President hereby requests authority in the name of Morgan County Commissioners to participate in the Ohio Department of Transportation contracts for the purchase of machinery, materials, supplies, or other articles which the Department has entered into pursuant to Revised Code Section 5513.01 (B).

Section 2. That the President is hereby authorized to agree in the name of Morgan County Commissioners to be bound by all terms and conditions as the Director of Transportation prescribes.

Section 3. That the President is hereby authorized to agree in the name of Morgan County Commissioners to directly pay the vendor, under each such contract of the Ohio Department of Transportation in which Morgan County Commissioners participates, for items it receives pursuant to the contract.

Section 4. That Morgan County Commissioners agrees to hold the Director of Transportation and the Ohio Department of transportation harmless for any claim or dispute arising out of participation in a contract pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code Section 5513.01 (B).

The undersigned duly qualified and acting members of the Morgan County Commissioners certifies that the foregoing is a true and correct copy of a resolution adopted at a legally convened meeting of the Morgan County Commissioners held on April 3, 2006.

Mr. David Brightbill, executive director for Washington/Morgan Community Action agency, contacted the commissioners' office regarding the March 20, 2006 minutes where the transit contract between their agency and the Department of Job and Family Services was discussed. The minutes should be corrected to read transportation of "Medicaid" individuals, not "medicare" individuals. Additionally, Mr. Brightbill pointed out that there is a thirty day mutual cancellation clause utilized only if Community Action fully intends to stop providing Medicaid transit services. He stated that Community Action fully intends to complete the current contract. The commissioners agreed to

correct the minutes for the record. The balance of the current contract will not go out for bid unless the above situation occurs.

Mr. Jim Ridenour, Director, Job and Family Services, submitted meeting requests for the following: Mr. Jim Ridenour, Ms. DeeAnn Vandine and Ms. Cathy Apperson to attend the Medicaid Managed Care Meeting on April 18th in Athens and Ms. Marilyn Horner to Inquiry 01 Training on May 1st in Zanesville.

Mr. Ridenour held the bid opening for the Summer Youth Program with Community Action submitting the only bid.

The commissioners are in receipt of the Class III / IV Compost Facility Annual Report Year 2005 submitted by Mr. Rob Reiter, District Coordinator, Southeast Solid Waste Authority.

The commissioners are in receipt of a request submitted by Ms. Pamela Montgomery, Extension Educator 4-H/FCS, to schedule a 6 week program titled Cooperative Parenting and Divorce, to be offered July 25th through August 29, 2006 for the Planning Commission to relocate during the above mentioned months to the commissioners' office. This would open up the Chamber Room for her group to meet. It was decided by the commissioners that the Planning Commission could meet in the Community Development Office during that time.

The commissioners are in receipt of an Application to Cross Public Road submitted by Sprint. Sprint is requesting permission to bore under County Road 79 located in Penn Township, Section 12, Morgan County for installation of a ½" diameter telephone cable.

The applicant agrees to protect said line with a 2" diameter casing and to place said line and casing a minimum of three (3) feet below the crown of the road, to install said line and casing by auger method or push under as the County Engineer may direct. The construction of this project will begin on or about April 3, 2006 and will be completed by June 2, 2006.

Mr. Larry Hivnor, OVER, discussed with the commissioners the scheduling a Medicare Part D training for seniors. The commissioners agreed that the training would be beneficial for the seniors and requested that Jim Ridenour, DJFS, coordinate the sessions.

Mr. Gary Woodward, Auditor, discussed with the commissioners the county employees contribution for health insurance. Currently non-union county employees are paying \$70.00 per month for family coverage.

Mr. David Couch, Director, MRDD, reported on the transit program. Mr. Couch stated that numerous people have contacted MRDD regarding MRDD "taking the program away from Community Action." In order to clarify this, the commissioners stated that a Request for Proposals was sent out to several prospective bidders under the guidelines established by ODOT. MRDD was the only vendor to submit a proposal. Mr. Couch went on to report that Medicaid clients can utilize either the service provided by Community Action or the service provided by MRDD. Mr. Couch went on to report that MRDD did receive a new van with funding from ODOT 2005 funds.

Ms. Linda Sheets, Office on Aging, reported that on May 16, 2006 the annual Senior Citizens Day will be held. A lunch and program at the Opera House will be held from 11:00 to 3:00 in honor of the Senior Citizens.

Mr. Jeff Driggs, Dog Warden, submitted his paperwork for the week of April 1st. He drove a total of 216 miles responding to dog calls with a total of 3 dogs being picked up. Of those dogs, 1 was redeemed by the owner, 2 were destroyed.

The final Public Hearing for the Morgan County 2006 CHIP grant was held with Mr. Jim Baker, Community Action, Ms. Joyce Drake, Community Action, Commissioners Mr. Ron Moore, Mr. Dean Cain, Mr. Rick Shriver, and Ms. Kelly Caldwell, Clerk, being present.

Mr. Baker presented the draft Budget Table IV and administrative plan Table III. Mr. Baker stated that Community Action was able to reduce the administrative fees by \$2,500 which will help the county on points.

After Mr. Baker's presentation the commissioners adopted the following resolution.
