The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, August 14, 2006 with the following members present:

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
The minutes of the August 7, 2006 meeting were read and approved.

The commissioners reported on their activities from the preceding week of August 7, 2006.

On Wednesday, Commissioners Moore, Cain and Shriver attended the Morgan County Community Improvement Corporation meeting in the Chamber Room of the Riecker Complex. Later that day they met with the Representatives from the West Malta Water Board, Representative Jimmy Stewart, and Misti Casto from Buckeye Hills to discuss West Malta's water line project. Also present was Auditor Gary Woodward. Also on Wednesday the commissioners traveled with Jeff Shaner from OSU Extension and prospective business people to search for an acceptable site for an industry.

On Thursday, the commissioners Cain and Shriver held their Community Meeting at Bristol on Thursday.

On Friday, Mr. Moore traveled to Marietta to attend the Area Agency on Aging Regional Advisory Council meeting.

Mr. Jeff Shaner, OSU Extension, reported that Ms. Amy Grove, Chamber of Commerce, is working on an ARC Value added grant for the Twin City Opera House.

Mr. Shaner, OSU Extension, reported that the Morgan County Chamber of Commerce will meet on Wednesday, August 16 at 6:00 PM. The meeting will be held at the Blue Rock Station.

Mr. Shaner reported that the Jr. Fair Sale Committee will meet this week. The Jr. Fair Board will be having a workday this week in preparation for the upcoming Morgan County Fair.

Mr. Shaner reported that Ms. Pam Montgomery, 4-H and Family Consumer Sciences Educator, is re-establishing the Car-Teens Program.

Mr. Shaner reported on the following activities over the previous weeks. There were 156 participants that attended the 4-H Committee sponsored Pool party. Cloverbud day camp was held and 55 participants attended.

Mr. Shaner reported that he will be attending the Ohio Economic Development Short Course on Thursday.

Mr. Jodi Murray, Department of Job and Family Services, submitted meeting request for Ms. Jan Snouffer to attend "Working with Mentally Challenged Parents" on September 21st in Athens. Mr. Steve Kinney, Ms. Ginger Bowen, & Ms. Angie Westfall to ODJFS Investigator's Training Seminar on September 28th and 29th in Worthington. Ms. Jan Snouffer to attend "Beyond the Bruises" training on October 3rd in Athens. Ms. Jan Snouffer to attend "Dealing with Angry, Negative, and Difficult People" on October 18th at the Athens Training Center

Mr. Jodi Murray, Department of Job and Family Services, submitted a supply request for ink cartridges for the Workforce Development Office.

Ms. Shannon Wells, Development Office, reported on the Health Center renovation project. The ceiling grids and flooring are being installed. Ms. Wells reported that they are still on schedule for a September 1st completion date.

Ms. Wells attended the Family and Children First council meeting last week.

She also reported on Morgan County Transit. Ms. Wells discussed that a policy is needed pertaining to the fee schedule for transportation. The commissioners recommended that the rates be set for children 12 years old and under can ride for free when accompanied by a paying adult in the county. The commissioners discussed this issue further and advised this will need to be given to the Transit Advisory Committee for further review.

Ms. Shannon Wells reported that she will be out of the office on Thursday, as she will be attending the Ohio Economic Development Short Course with Commissioner Shriver and Mr. Jeff Shaner from OSU Extension.

Ms. Wells reported that she had a meeting last week with the Ohio Department of Development, Office of Urban Development, concerning the Brownfield Sites. Ms. Wells also reported that she had received a call from Michele Blackburn, Outdoor Extravaganza Committee, regarding a check she has for the Morgan County Commissioners to help with the Education Center Project.

Ms. Wells also reported on the county credit card policy that she is working on. She reported that policies from Ohio University and Muskingum County were being reviewed and she would get a draft together for the Commissioners to review.

06-359-Authorizing Resolution

A resolution authorizing the filing of (an) application(s) with the Ohio Department of Transportation for grants through the US DOT Federal Transit Administration (FTA), as authorized under Federal Transit Laws, as codified, 49 USC Section 531 1, Financial Assistance for other than urbanized areas and funds available from the Ohio Public Transportation Grant Program and executing a contract with the Ohio Department of Transportation upon grant application approval.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation is authorized to make grants for a public transportation program;

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of the project costs in the program;

WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under 49 USC Section 53 11 the applicant give an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the U.S. Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the applicant that disadvantaged business enterprise be used to the fullest extent possible in connection with this/these project(s), and that definite procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that disadvantaged businesses shall have the maximum construction contracts, supplies, equipment contracts, or consultant and other services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY The Morgan County Commissioners
(Governing Body of Applicant)

1. That the President of the Morgan County Commissioners is authorized to execute and file (an) application(s) on behalf of the Morgan County Commissioners with the Ohio Department of Transportation to aid in the financing of capital and operating assistance projects pursuant to 49 USC Section 53 11 and the Ohio Public Transportation Grant Program.
2. The President of the Morgan County Commissioners is authorized to execute and file with such applications and assurance or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation effectuating the purposes of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
3. That the President of the Morgan County Commissioners is authorized to furnish such

additional information as the Ohio Department of Transportation may require in connection with the application for the program of projects submitted to FTA.

4. That the President of the Morgan County Commissioners is authorized to set forth and execute affirmative disadvantaged business policies in connection to any procurement made as part of the project.

5. That the President of the Morgan County Commissioners is authorized to execute grant agreements on behalf of the Morgan County Commissioners with the Ohio Department of Transportation for aid in the financing of operating and capital assistance projects.

06-361 Resolution

The Board of County Commissioners of Morgan County, met in regular session on the 14th day of August, 2006 at the offices of said Board with the following members present: Rick Shriver, Dean Cain, Ron Moore. Mr. Moore moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities has provided the undersigned Commissioners with a copy of Resolution # 06-362 declaring that the current 1.97 mill levy for the operation of programs, services and facilities of the Morgan County Board of Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, known locally as the Mary Hammond Programs (but separate and distinct from the legal entity known as the "Mary Hammond Adult Activity Center, Inc.") will expire December 31, 2006, thereby reducing available funds and declaring that it is necessary to renew said levy to continuing raising monies for the operation of programs, services and facilities by the Morgan County Board of Metal Retardation and Developmental Disabilities and for acquisition, construction, renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of mental retardation and developmental disabilities facilities, and that the amount of taxes that may be raised within the ten mill limitation may be insufficient to provide the necessary requirements of the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities determines that the amount of additional funds necessary to operate the programs of the Board is \$411,159.00 per year, for the tax years 2007,2008,2009,2010 and 2011 ; and

WHEREAS, it is the determination of the Morgan County Board of County Commissioners that without renewing said levy, the amount of tax within the ten mill limitation of levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide the necessary requirements of Morgan County's contribution to the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, of which the County is a part, as described in this resolution for the tax years, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011 for the purposes stated above and pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.1 9 and 5705.222; Now Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Morgan County Board of County Commissioners be and is hereby directed to immediately certify a copy of this resolution pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.03 (B) to the Morgan County Auditor requesting that the Morgan County Auditor certify to the Morgan County Board of County Commissioners the total current tax valuation of Morgan County and, the amount of money that will be generated per year, by renewing the 1.97 mill levy as requested by the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities as and for the purposes stated herein.

The Board of County Commissioners of Morgan County, met in regular session on the 14th day of August, 2006 at the offices of said Board with the following members present:

Mr. Cain duly moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities has provided the undersigned Commissioners with a copy of Resolution #2006-06-01 declaring that the

current 1.97 mill levy for the operation of programs, services and facilities of the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, known locally as the Mary Hammond Programs (but separate and distinct from the legal entity known as the "Mary Hammond Adult Activity Center, Inc.") will expire December 31, 2006, thereby reducing available funds, and declaring that it is necessary to renew said levy to continue raising monies for the operation of programs, services and facilities by the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities and for the acquisition, construction, renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of mental retardation and developmental disabilities facilities, and that the amount of taxes that may be raised within the ten mill limitation, without renewal of said levy, may be insufficient to provide the necessary requirements of the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities determines that the amount of additional funds necessary to operate the Programs of the Board is \$ 411,159.00 per year, for the tax years, 2007, 2008, 2009,2010 and 2011; and

WHEREAS, it is the determination of the Morgan County Board of County Commissioners that the amount of tax within the ten mill limitation of levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide the necessary requirements of Morgan County's contribution to the Morgan County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, of which the County is a part, as described in this resolution for the tax years, 2007, 2008, 2009,2010 and 201 1 for the purposes stated above and pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.19 and 5705.222, and that a renewal of said levy is necessary to raise said monies; Now Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provisions of O.R.C. Section 5705.19 and 5705.222 the Board of County Commissioners of Morgan County, Ohio declares it necessary to levy a tax in excess of such limitation for the operation of programs and services and for the acquisition, construction, renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of the mental retardation and developmental disabilities facilities known locally as the MARY HAMMOND PROGRAMS FOR CITIZENS OF MORGAN COUNTY WHO ARE MENTALLY RETARDED AND/OR DEVELOPMENTALLY DISABLED (but separate and distinct from the legal entity known as the "Mary Hammond Adult Activity Center, Inc."), and submit to the electors a renewal tax levy; and now **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that such renewal levy shall be at a rate not exceeding 1.97 mills for each one dollar of tax valuation which amounts to \$0.1 97 cents for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation for five (5) years commencing with the tax year of 2007; and now

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Elections of Morgan County, Ohio be and is hereby directed to submit this issue to such election to be held on November 7, **2006**, said date being the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November; and now

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the clerk of this Board be and is hereby directed to immediately certify a copy of this Resolution along with the attached suggested ballot language addendum to the Board of Elections of Morgan County, Ohio prior to the date of August 24, 2006.
