

**MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
RIECKER BUILDING**

The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, May 12, 2008 with the following members present:

Dean Cain, President
Don Reynolds, Vice-President
Rick Shriver, Member

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag. The minutes of the May 5, 2008 meeting were read and approved.

08-234 Motion by Mr. Dean Cain and seconded by Mr. Don Reynolds to approve the minutes from May 5, 2008.

Vote Don Reynolds- yea, Rick Shriver- yea, Dean Cain- yea. Motion Carried

Commissioners reported on their activities for the week May 5, 2008.

On Thursday, Commissioners Cain and Reynolds attended the EZ Grout Ribbon Cutting and Open House. Mr. Reynolds attended the Morgan County Community Improvement Corporation meeting and Mr. Cain attended the Regional Joint Jail meeting.

On Friday, Commissioners Cain and Reynolds attended the Council of Governments meeting.

Bob Bennett discussed a line fence dispute. Mr. Bennett rebuilt his half of the line fence and explained the adjacent landowner still refuses to rebuild his half. According to Mr. Bennett, the old fence is in disrepair, full of brush, and some posts have rotted off at the ground. Because the landowner has declined to build his half of the fence, Mr. Bennett spoke with the Windsor Township trustees and was unsatisfied with their response. According to Mr. Bennett, the trustees did look at the property and admitted the fence is in disrepair. According to state law, briars, debris and brush must be kept clear four feet on either side of the fence. Mr. Bennett has spoken with both the Morgan County Prosecutor's Office, and receiving no satisfaction there, spoke with an attorney in Muskingum County. Mr. Bennett's attorney advised him that he believed his claim was legitimate and that he should consult other officials to seek their input. Mr. Bennett said the news media have been contacted. Mr. Bennett inquired who is responsible for auditing the township books. Mr. Reynolds noted the State used to but now the township can hire an independent auditor to audit the books. Commissioners noted the township clerk should have that information. Mr. Bennett planned on putting livestock into the pasture by spring but has been unable to do so. Mr. Bennett added that he doesn't like to see all this scandal in Morgan County. Mr. Bennett noted he refuses to pay the township tax until this issue is resolved, but will continue to pay his property taxes. No one disputes the fact the adjacent landowner must build the fence. Commissioner Shriver inquired if Mr. Bennett contacted the Ohio Association of Township Trustees. Mr. Bennett noted he hasn't but he will and feels this may end up in court.

Jeff Shaner, OSU Extension Office, and Jim Rex, Amy Roberts and Bob Thurman request the Extension Levy be put on the ballot for the November 2008 election, for renewal. The levy passed during the 2004

primary election and expires the end of 2008. Commissioners agreed to put this on the ballot so the citizens of Morgan County could exercise their rights and vote on whether to renew the Extension tax levy.

Steve Hook, Engineer, discussed nails being tossed along blind spots and curves on Lemon Hill. This has been going on for at least six months. In order to catch whomever is committing this crime a camera needs to be placed to gather evidence for criminal charges.

Vicki Quesinberry, Director, Job and Family Services, submitted meeting requests for Crystal Moler to attend "Financial History and Allocations", on May 12th, in Zanesville; Freda VanHorn and Kim Reed to attend "Elements of a WIA Youth Program", on June 2nd and 3rd, in Columbus; Kay Drabik and Mary Woodward to attend "Covered Families and Children Medical System Work Around", on May 28th and 29th, in Zanesville; Tim Taylor to attend "TPOC Skills Assessment", on June 19th, in Zanesville; Ginger Bowen to attend "Quarterly Fraud Control Meeting" on June 4th, in Athens; Steve Kinney to attend "OCDA General Membership Meeting", on May 15th, in Columbus. A supply request for HP Toner was submitted.

Jeff Shaner, OSU Extension, noted the Morgan County Community Improvement Corporation will hold a special meeting on Thursday, May 15th, 9:00am, at the Learning Center.

Steve Hook, Engineer, and Gary Woodward, Auditor, discussed Worker's Compensation.

Jane Snouffer, Job and Family Services, inquired on increasing the county's mileage rate. Mrs. Snouffer explained that she often takes her own vehicle on children service calls, due to needing a four wheel drive to get into some areas. Commissioners noted the rate was increased this year by five cents and they also offered to other county vehicles for use by Job and Family Services.

Paul Wood inquired on getting help for Embree Park in Pennsville. Commissioners told Mr. Wood the Community Development Block Grant would be a great source. The deadline for this year's CDBG has passed, but Commissioners encouraged Mr. Wood to apply next year. Mr. Wood inquired if dogs had to wear their license on their collars. Commissioner Reynolds noted it would be a good idea. It would make it faster to trace dogs back to their owners.

John Sampson, Transit, provided an update on transportation. January through April a total of 526 Elderly Disabled, 685 General Service Riders, 1247 Contract-Elderly Disabled, and 2373 Contract-Other Riders

were transported. A total of 85,218 miles were driven during those months. Compared to last year, during the same months, Transit almost doubled their total riders and miles.

Robert Wiseman, RW Mechanical Services and Contracting Ltd, discussed problems with a 480 volt driver going bad in the Heating/Ventilation and Air Conditioning unit for the Riecker Building, due to apparent lightning damage.

Shannon Wells and Traci Kidd, Morgan County Commissioners' Development Office, noted June 10th the First Lady, Francis Strickland will be attending the Family and Children First Council meeting at the Learning Center, 9:30am - 11:30am. Projects were reviewed for the Community Development Block Grant. Mrs. Wells stated a child pulled the fire alarm at the Muskingum Valley Health Center and no one knew how to shut it off. A large pothole behind the Health Department needs fixed. Mrs. Wells inquired if it could be fixed when State Route 376 is paved this summer. Commissioners informed Mrs. Wells she would need to contact the company that is paving 376. Mrs. Wells mentioned copper wire being stripped from one of the Transit vehicles.

Mr. Steve Hook, Morgan County Engineer, chaired a public hearing to appoint members to the County Sub-Committee for Issue I for Round #23. This was previously known as Issue II- Ohio Public Works. Those in attendance were: Mr. Kevin Manning, Mayor, Village of Stockport, Mr. John Wells, Mayor, McConnellsville, Mr. Dean Cain, President, Morgan County Commissioners, Mr. Don Reynolds, Vice-President, Morgan County Commissioners, Mr. Rick Shriver, Member, Morgan County Commissioners, Mr. Steve Hook, Engineer, and Ms. Andrea Plummer, Clerk, Morgan County Commissioners.

The committee is a 5 member group from the following government entities: 1 member from the Commissioners' office, 1 member from the Mayor's office, 1 member from the Township Trustees', 1 member from the County Engineer's office, and the 5th member to be chosen by the other four to represent the general public.

The Township Trustees will hold their meeting at a later date to name their representative to the Board.

The 5th member will be chosen at a subsequent meeting, by the other four members, to represent the general public. Anyone interested in representing the general public should contact one of the Board Representatives by Tuesday, May 27, 2008. John McCort is interested in this position.

Jeff Shaner, OSU Extension, discussed the county entering into an enterprise zone agreement with Mahle Engine Components USA, Inc.

Mahle Engine Components USA, Inc., shall create within a time period not exceeding 36 months after the commencement of construction of the aforesaid facility, the equivalent of 55 new full-time permanent job opportunities. Mahle Engine Components USA, Inc., will use its best efforts to retain 50 existing full-time equivalent jobs at the McConnellsville facility. Mahle Engine Components USA, Inc., shall grant the Village of McConnellsville an easement for water and/or sewer lines across the property. Said easement shall be parallel to State Rout 60 and within 25 feet of the ODOT Right of Way. Morgan County will offer a 100% Tax Abatement on Building and Site Improvements related to the business. No exemption shall commence before 2008 nor extend beyond 2017.
