The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, July 21, 2008 with the following members present:

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag. The minutes of the July 14, 2008 meeting were read and approved.

**08-332** Motion by Mr. Dean Cain and seconded by Mr. Don Reynolds to approve the minutes from July 14, 2008.

Commissioners reported on their activities for the week July 14, 2008.

On Tuesday, Commissioner Cain met with Rick Newberry to discuss payment for the cleanup at the TTI Tire facility.

On Wednesday, Commissioner Cain met with Shannon Wells, Morgan County Commissioners' Development Office, and Vicki Quesinberry, Director, Job and Family Services, to discuss TANF funding.

On Wednesday, Commissioner Shriver met with the Executive Director of The Wilds, Evan Blumer.

On Friday, Commissioner Cain met with John Sampson and American Bus to take delivery of the new Transit vehicle.

Pam Montgomery, OSU Extension Office, requested a meeting with Commissioners to discuss inaccuracies within the minutes concerning the Extension Levy. Ms. Montgomery stated this is the normal cycle for a renewal for the Extension Levy to be put on the ballot. A correction needs to be made noting the Extension Advisory Committee requested the renewal being placed on the fall ballot, not the 4-H Advisory Board. The Extension Advisory Committee consists of county residents representing the four program areas in the Extension Office: Family and Consumer Sciences, Agriculture and Natural Resources, 4-H Youth Development, and Community Development. The committee helps the Extension Office staff determine the needs and interests of clientele and programming direction. A correction needs to be made concerning who pays for the levy being put on the ballot. The minutes stated the 4-H Board pays for it. Ms. Montgomery reported there is no such thing as a 4-H Board. However, there is a Morgan County Extension 4-H Youth Development Advisory Committee, but it does not pay for the levy being put on the ballot. There is no fee to put the levy on the ballot. The Extension Advisory Committee is working to form a Levy Committee, to collect donations of individuals and organizations that support the Extension Mission- "Engaging people to strengthen their lives and communities through research-based educational programs", to pay for the campaign. Any persons interested in learning about the Extension Office programs are encouraged to contact their office at 740-962-4854. Ms. Montgomery noted Chris Penrose and herself will attend 4-H camp next week at Camp Hervida. Cloverbud Camp was last week at the Meigsville Community Center.

Heidi Burns, Job and Family Services, submitted meeting requests for Kim Reed, Freda Vanhorn, and Debby Griesmyer to “Updating Eligibility and Other Program Changes for Childcare”, on August 14<sup>th</sup>, in Guernsey County; Kim Reed and Vicki Quesinberry to “WIA meeting”, on July 21<sup>st</sup>, in Caldwell; DeeAnn Vandine to “Business Intelligence Channel Software”, on August 13<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Burns also submitted a supply request for MPBE, Mother Board for Main Telephone System, PRIB-PRI Card. The Commissioners approved the following resolution for Child Support Awareness Month

**WHEREAS**, parenting and child support go hand in hand in ensuring grow up safe and healthy, and children and families stay out of poverty; and

**WHEREAS**, ensuring that children receive the financial support they deserve involves working partnerships between county, state and federal agencies, parents, legislators, judges, healthcare professionals, advocacy groups, employers and many others; and

**WHEREAS**, through these partnerships, Ohio collected nearly two billion dollars, continuing to lead the nation in dollars collected on non-public assistance child support orders in 2007, and

**WHEREAS**, through the leadership of the *Morgan* County Child Support Enforcement Agency, many children’s lives are brighter because of the following accomplishments in the past year:

*The Morgan County Child Support Enforcement Agency served one thousand one hundred and ninety five (1,195) families. The agency distributed \$1,444,912.52 in current child support payments and distributed \$445,285.41 in arrearage payments in Federal Fiscal Year ending Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, 2007, and*

**WHEREAS**, with the recognition of the above successes comes the acknowledgment that our children’s lives count enough to pursue every possible effort to ensure that Ohio children receive the financial support they deserve.

Della Bratton telephoned Commissioners to discuss the Environmental Super Fund. Ms. Bratton stated she researched this before and found that previous Commissioners had Morgan County taken off the list. Ms.

Bratton requested the current Commissioners to research the Super Fund and put Morgan County back on the list. Commissioners noted they would investigate it.

Shannon Wells, Morgan County Commissioners' Development Office, reported Transit received their new modified mini-van, 2008 Chevy Uplander. This vehicle was paid by State and Federal funding with a 10% match out of Transit's budget. On July 22<sup>nd</sup>, Mrs. Wells will attend the Eastern Ohio Development Alliance meeting, in Delroy, Ohio. On July 23<sup>rd</sup>, Mrs. Wells and Ms. Kidd will attend Prevailing Wage training in Columbus. Mrs. Wells provided an update on the 2007 Formula projects. Ms. Kidd will hold a pre-bid meeting for the electrical work at the Opera House. The Development Office is working on obtaining concrete bids for concrete work for the Stockport Concession/Restroom project. Mrs. Wells reported the steel work is finishing up at the Stockport Concession/Restroom and noted there is not enough money to pay for the electrical work that needs to be done. Mrs. Wells plans to obtain cost estimates from electricians and investigate other funding options. A discussion was held concerning researching funding options to help bring E-Retailing Inc., into the county. The Enterprise Zone Agreement for E-Z Grout was discussed. It is understood that E-Z Grout did not agree to operate the business at the site for 20 years. The tax abatement is for 15 years. Mrs. Wells noted she would contact E-Z Grout to discuss the situation.
