

**MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
RIECKER BUILDING**

The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, January 26, 2009 with the following members present:

Dean Cain, President
Don Reynolds, Vice-President
Mike Reed, Member

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag. The minutes of the January 20, 2009 meeting were read and approved.

09-56 Motion by Mr. Dean Cain and seconded by Mr. Don Reynolds to approve the minutes from January 20, 2009.

Vote Don Reynolds- yea, Mike Reed- yea, Dean Cain- yea. Motion Carried

Sandy Lahmers, Soil & Water, Bruce Dozer, Board of Supervisors Soil & Water, Patty Dyer(NCRS), and Kevin Williams, Board of Supervisors Soil & Water, met with the Commissioners to discuss the Soil & Water funding issues. Patty Dyer with NCRS discussed the new Farm Bill and went over funding opportunities that would exist through that bill for the county Soil & Water, as long as the office is staffed. Mr. Dozer discussed that if the county Soil & Water office was not funded then residents would be forced to travel to either Muskingum or Washington Counties to obtain services. Commissioner Cain stated that certain programs are mandated to be funded and that Soil and Water is not one of those programs, but does feel that it is an important program in the county. Mrs. Lahmers discussed what services their office offers to local farmers and land owners and that they have taken steps to cut expenses in their office. Mrs. Lahmers stated they have a 0.4 Staff person, have moved their office to help save on rent and that she is working in Washington County now 3 days a week. Mrs. Lahmers also thanked the Commissioners for all of their support and stated they appreciate everything the commissioners have done. Patty Dyer with NCRS went on to discuss the cost share and the services that are offered locally such as Soil Conservation, Erosion control, spring development, animal waste management, assisting farmers with pasture issues, forestry practices such as tree plantings. Mrs. Lahmers discussed the educational programs they offer to children, such as the 4th grade Ag. Field day and last year they were able to arrange for one of the local schools to come out to Hook Lake for an entire day of learning through various stations. Commissioner Cain stated that as of now they do plan on continuing to fund the Soil and Water office and will continue to help if they can.

Tammy Ray, Dog Warden reported that there are currently three dogs at the Kennel, one dog was euthanized and none were redeemed. They currently have 6 dogs in foster care. Ms. Ray asked if the commissioners had discussed the extension on the sale of dog tags to February 6th.

Dave Parmiter, stopped in to see the Commissioners.

Pam Montgomery, OSU Extension, discussed with the commissioners that she would like for the commissioners to have the opportunity to meet with different staff members from time to time. Ms. Montgomery also inquired if meeting with the commissioners every two weeks is still acceptable and what kind of information would they like her to share about the OSU Extension office. She invited newly elected Commissioner Mike Reed to visit the office. She reminded the commissioners of the Extension Advisory Committee meeting on Tuesday January 27th at 6:00 pm in Room 325. Ms. Montgomery updated the commissioners on the following items.

On January 15, 2009 County directors across the State of Ohio participated in a live video update from their Extension Director, Keith Smith. He discussed that State funding was cut 4.75 in the fall of 2008, in January of 2009 funding was cut an additional 5.75 and the Administration is concerned about FY 2009 budget projections. A task force has been convened with representatives across Extension developing different staffing models for consideration by OSU Extension Administrative Cabinet to address the cuts. If the budget shortfall is expected, then OSU Extension Morgan County can anticipate downsizing as individuals will lose their jobs, at this point she is unsure how many. This depends on several factors such as: what the task force comes up with, Federal dollars for funding, the potential federal stimulus package, County Funding (Morgan County has a current levy), how the governor allocated future cuts, and rate of retirements. Ms. Montgomery stated that they are unsure how the cuts will be distributed across the organization, and will not know that until the final plan has been determined. If cuts occur, she expects they will be across the organization, at the county and state level. Extension is meeting with Chancellor Fingerhut in early February and holding legislative meetings across the state in preparation for the biennium budget decisions, meeting with folks in the university, and have already met with Richard Cordray (when he was State Treasurer). She also updated the commissioners on Community Development/Tourism. The Grant/Contract which originally was received through Morgan County Department of Job and Family Services for Amy Grove's tourism positive has been cut twice. The original amount was \$45,000 and is now \$25,312. The position will end when there is no more funding. They have some carryover from previous Community Development/ Tourism funds so we can probably keep the position around until sometime between September and December. She will be working on the contract budget and looking at funds in the next two week or two. Ms. Montgomery reported that she and Ms. Grove are planning on offering some Hospitality and Marketing Training sessions in the next few months. Family and Consumer Sciences Programming update was on the January 20th program, Helping Children Cope with Divorce which Ms. Montgomery offered. The 2 hour program is for parents going through Divorce or Dissolution with children in the home under the age of 18. The program is offered 6 times a year. Basic Nutrition Education programs continue to be offered monthly at the MCUM-Jesus Loves Me Thrift Store. The topic for January and February is the Meat and Bean Group. Dining with Diabetes, a three week program, will be offered March 12, 19, and 26, 2009 from 6:30-8:30 pm at the Presbyterian Church in McConnellsville. Final plans for the program are being made. Interested parties can call the office to learn more. She also noted that 4-H is on the move for 2009, volunteer interviews are happening, new volunteer orientation trainings are scheduled. Junior Leaders, Junior Fair Board, CARTEENS, Older Youth in Training, and Fashion Board have reorganized for 2009. 4-h Promotions were held at the Junior High on January 23, 2009. Promotions are scheduled for the week of February 9-13, 2009 at all of the Elementary Schools in the county. 4-H Open House will be March 3rd from 3-7 pm. Families can stop by and enjoy punch and cookies provided the 4-H Junior Leaders, find a 4-H Club in their area or spend some time looking at project books. Ms. Montgomery also noted that Chris Penrose has held Pesticide Recertification and if someone missed those trainings they can contact the office and talk with Chris and he can work with them to get something scheduled. Ms. Montgomery stated that Chris would also like to invite the Commissioners to the Cattleman's Banquet/Ladies Night Out on February 2nd at the American Legion. Social Hour is at 6:00 pm and Dinner at 6:30 pm.

Ms. Kelly Caldwell and Ms. Kate Christman of Saving Pets One at a Time, Inc. (S.P.O.T.) a new rescue group in Morgan County, met with the Commissioners to discuss their organization. Ms. Caldwell stated that Saving Pets One at a Time, Inc. is a Humane Society, registered as such with the Secretary of State of Ohio, in full compliance with all the pertinent laws regulating non-profit organizations and humane societies, under Ohio Revised Code 1717.05. Ms. Caldwell discussed that S.P.O.T. is organizing low-income spay/neuter clinics within the county twice a year. They feel that making spay neuter affordable is the key to controlling the unwanted pet population. They are participating in a free program to reduce the feral cat population through a catch/neuter/release program, offered by the Capital Area Humane Society in Columbus. Ms. Caldwell stated they foster and adopt unwanted animals, mostly dogs and cats, but will help with all animals. These animals that come to them are through owner release, or rescue, or rescue from "death row" in animal pounds. They will also offer assistance for struggling pet owners to help them keep the pets they have, rather than dumping them, or forcing the county to deal with them. We will provide animal food, shelter, crates, bedding, and vet care, as we can afford to, to those who are in the greatest need. Ms. Caldwell also discussed the Rascals unit which provides low cost/free, spay/neuter which will be coming to Morgan County in August and September 2009. Ms. Caldwell discussed that a county can have more than one Humane Society and would welcome more. She stated they currently have 10 members and 3 board members, Ms. Moody, Ms. Christman and Ms. Caldwell serve on the board. She went on to discuss that S.P.O.T. had taken 5 dogs to have them spay/neutered and vaccinated. They are also working on trying to secure grant monies and are here to support the community and officials any way they can. For more information Ms. Caldwell and Ms. Christman noted residents can log onto www.morganspot.org.

Stevan Hook, Morgan County Engineer met with the Commissioners to discuss DDTI centerline and GPS mapping. Mr. Hook plans on meeting with the Township Trustees to discuss the mileage payments and the 1% cut in mileage due to being overpaid in mileage in prior years. Mr. Hook stated he is looking at a used 2001 ton - ton and half dump bed truck. The truck would be equipped with a snowplow and would be cheaper to operate than the larger trucks they have. Mr. Hook checked on trading in a used vehicle they were considering selling and with the trade-in allowance the cost would be less than \$19,000 for the truck.

Vicki Quesinberry, Morgan County Department of Job and Family Services, met with the Commissioners and submitted meeting requests for Vicki Quesinberry to Marietta, Ohio on January 26, 2009 to attend the "Governor's Conversation on Poverty". Ms. Quesinberry also submitted supply requests for Toner Cartridges for HP 8100 Laser Printers (6) at \$172.00 each, the lowest quote was CDWG, and 3 additional supply requests for supplies from the WIA fund. Ms. Quesinberry stated that Bob Fink with Maximus was in the agency on January 23, 2009 to get information on the lease. He will be getting in touch with the Commissioners in the near future. Mr. Fink, Ms. Quesinberry stated agreed with Dave Smith of the State of Ohio that there may be a problem with the calculations. She will keep the Commissioners updated on this issue.

Gary Woodward, Auditor Morgan County, met with the Commissioners to discuss Block Grant funding from a grant for last year concerning Micro-enterprise.

Elaine Flesher, Morgan County Health Department and David O'Riley, State of Ohio Community Service Council met with the Commissioners to discuss the Public Health Infrastructure Plan. Mrs. Flesher stated they are moving into the planning stages of the Emergency Preparedness plan. She discussed that she will be doing public speaking in February to try and help obtain volunteers and plans on doing training in March. Mrs. Flesher noted if they are to obtain NIMS compliance they need to have volunteers registered which will provide liability coverage. There will be a need for clerical, runners, and medical professionals. Mr. O'Riley stated that they are developing plans which will include a list of names of volunteers and the action plan, this is essential in an emergency situation so that you can put an alert out. He went on to discuss that they are trying to build a structure of volunteers within the community, Mr. O'Riley stated that

there are approximately 10,000 volunteers statewide with over half coming from the medical professional's field. Mrs. Flesher discussed the registration of volunteers and the liability protection that covers them during any declared response training, exercise they are involved with or any type of disaster they would help with. Ms. Flesher noted that Public Health is having an exercise on April 2nd at the Health Department and more information would follow prior to that event.

Darlene Cain, Morgan County Senior Center, dropped off invoices to the Commissioners.

Shannon Wells, Morgan County Commissioners' Development Office, presented an Environmental Review that she needed signatures for. Mrs. Wells discussed the Micro enterprise Grant and what that Grant is used for, along with how her office is paid out of that Grant. Mrs. Wells discussed the Small Business class that she is offering beginning next week. The class runs for 5 weeks, on Tuesday and Thursday's from 6-8pm and has a cost of \$50.00 which includes a workbook. She requested permission to use the Commissioner's room to meet in a couple nights due to a scheduling conflict with the other meeting room. Mrs. Wells stated that she attended the EODA Board Meeting last week at Salt Fork. The Coordinated Transportation Planning Meeting has been rescheduled due to the inclement weather. She has also followed up with Jimmy Stewart and Debbie Phillips on a previous issue. Mrs. Wells stated that she had met with Mike Workman and the new McConnellsville Village Administrator to discuss the Twp. Rd. 209 project. Mrs. Wells also updated the Commissioners on the request she had made of AEP for future development projects.

Kelly Hardman, Morgan Metropolitan Housing Authority, met with the commissioners to update them on events at the MMHA. Ms. Hardman stated that even though they receive no funding through the county she felt it was important to keep them updated on what is going on. Ms. Hardman discussed the programs that they offer. She stated they offer 2 rental assistance programs and a Home ownership program. She stated they currently have 60 apartments and 6 handicap accessible apartments at the MMHA complex, have 140 a month in Section 8 housing vouchers in the community and have 2 families enrolled in the Home Ownership program. Ms. Hardman discussed the qualifications for these 3 programs and discussed the Family Self Sufficiency case management services they also offer. This is geared towards helping families to set goals and plans to get them off of public assistance. Mrs. Hardman discussed the various grants that they secure every year for funding. She reported on the upgrades they have been doing to the apartments at the complex, such as furnace replacements and the addition of central air in all the units. They are also working on replacing carpet in some of the upstairs units. There are 20 units with basements and they have replaced the decking with the new composite decking material. They are installing new windows in all the units. She stated that for 2010 they would like to begin replacing some of the bathroom fixtures. She discussed if anyone has any housing issues to come and talk to her. Ms. Hardman discussed the current staffing. She went on to note that she serves as President of the Habitat for Humanity and also serves on the Continuum of Care, where they have been discussing the homeless issue in Morgan County.

Tom Jenkins, Morgan County Sheriff, submitted the Mandatory Drug Fines and Proceeds from the Sale of Property report for the commissioner's review.

The commissioners submitted the January 2009 Landfill report to the Ohio EPA.
