

**MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
RIECKER BUILDING**

The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, March 9, 2009 with the following members present:

Don Reynolds, Vice-President  
Mike Reed, Member

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The minutes of the March 2, 2009 meeting were read and approved.

**09-135** Motion by Mr. Dean Cain and seconded by Mr. Don Reynolds to approve the minutes from March 2, 2009.

Residents of Morgan County present in the Commissioners office today were Gail O’Keefe, Claire Farnsworth, Dorothy Shriver, Lillian Pennington, Tammy Ray and Lisa Post.

Lillian Pennington, Tammy Ray, and Lisa Post, Morgan County Humane Society met with the Commissioners. Ms. Pennington stated that Morgan County has come a long way since last year and the county now has 2 fully functioning groups in the county. Ms. Pennington commended S.P.O.T. on their ability to offer programs that deal with both cats and dogs. Ms. Pennington wished the future Dog Warden success whoever it may be. Ms. Pennington stated that the Morgan County Humane Society is moving forward and has plans for the future. Ms. Pennington stated that the Humane Society has received notice that the Commissioners have exercised their right to terminate the contract between the Morgan County Commissioners and the Morgan County Humane Society. Ms. Pennington stated that “This will serve as notice that the Morgan County Humane Society will vacate by next Monday, March 16, 2009 the Morgan County Dog Pound.” She stated that she appreciated the opportunity to serve the dogs during the last 10 months. Tammy Ray commented that for a long time the thought was that dogs didn’t matter, but has sent hat change in the county. They noted that 3 adoptions took place this week and that a family in New Hampshire is adopting a puppy, which will be flying out to New Hampshire.

Pam Montgomery, OSU Extension gave an update on 4-H. New clubs are forming and clubs are organizing for 2009. Open House was held on March 2, 2009, with over 40 individuals stopping by the office. Junior Leaders sponsored the event. Enrollment deadline is April 1<sup>st</sup>. Ms. Montgomery reported that she will start offering programs at South and West Elementary Schools this month as part of their after school programs. First program is March 11 at South Elementary. Junior Leaders would like to once again clean up the flower bed in front of the Riecker Building and plant annuals and requested permission for this. The first QA session will be held March 28<sup>th</sup>. FCS Update was the Dining with Diabetes starts March 12, 2009 with 12 individuals are registered, registration is now closed. Helping Children Cope with Divorce is scheduled for March 17, 2009. Registration is still open. She reported that she will be teaching a Nutrition Program today at Jesus Loves Me Thrift Shop on reading the Nutrition Facts Label. The program is open to anyone. She will teach the same topic next month on April 13, 2009. A Behavior Management program has been scheduled for March 31, 2009. AG/NR update was as follows, Pastures for Profit School and the Master Gardener program is going well. Tourism/CD, CVB/ county is going to the Spotlight on Appalachian Ohio

Art, Music & Travel Show in Zanesville on the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. The Restructuring Document was discussed and given to the Commissioners. Ms. Montgomery noted that 20 Educators have been notified that of the reduction in workforce. They are doing away with County directors and moving to county coordinators. Ms. Montgomery and Mr. Penrose will now only cover one area as opposed to 2 areas and if the county would like a 3<sup>rd</sup> Educator the cost share would be \$60,000, with the 1<sup>st</sup> Educator costing \$25,000 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Educator costing \$38,200 next year. The Commissioners inquired as to how much money the tax levy brings in every year. Ms. Montgomery stated \$171,500.00 yearly.

Vicki Quesinberry, Director, Department of Job and Family Services and Heidi Burns, Fiscal Supervisor, Department of Job and Family Services, submitted meeting requests for Kim Reed and Freda Vanhorn to Columbus on April 8, 2009 for "Stimulus Youth Experience Program", Kim Reed and Tina Work to Nelsonville on March 13, 2009 for "Education and Training Consortium Meeting". Ms. Quesinberry and Mrs. Burns submitted the invoice for the monthly portion of the mandated share for State Fiscal Year 2009, in the amount of \$6,490.00. Ms. Quesinberry and Mrs. Burns reported that the document destruction with IDS, Information Destruction Services, Inc. quote was \$1800.00. Ms. Quesinberry and Ms. Burns submitted a MOU between AFSCME Ohio Council 8, AFL-CIO and AFSCME Local 3560, AFL-CIO, and the Morgan County Department of Job and Family Services that reads: "The Union agrees to forego the pay increase for AFSCME Local 3560, Morgan County Department of Job and Family Services for April, 2009. All other terms and conditions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement will remain in full force. The MOU is hereby executed on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2009. Ms. Quesinberry and Mrs. Burns reported that the BCFTA (Bureau of County Finance and Technical Assistance) wanted to make sure the Commissioners were aware of past untransferred social service costs. We have been current from 2007 to present. 2003 to 2007 have untransferred amounts. (-400,000)(1998). Discussion on IV-D Contract Prosecutor vs. Private attorney. Commissioner Cain and Commissioner Reynolds stated that they had spoken with the Prosecutor last week concerning the IV-D contract. It was recommended to do a 9 month contract to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2009.

Blythe Schubert, Kate Love Simpson Library, stopped in the commissioners' office. Mrs. Schubert thanked the Commissioners for attending the computer presentation that was held at the library. Mrs. Schubert submitted a letter requesting to use the commons area for parking.

Mr. Hook stated that we should now by the end of the day on March 17<sup>th</sup> as to what stimulus money was awarded.

Sherry Hill, VFW presented a new flag to the Morgan County Commissioners for the Riecker Building. The Commissioners and several other county officials were in attendance.

Shannon Wells, Morgan County Development Office reported that she met with several prospective business owners. She updated the commissioners on the Economic development projects. Mrs. Wells noted that Friday the grant for the Opera House came back. Mrs. Wells stated that her Micro-Enterprise class graduated this week. She has been keeping a log since December, and has 20 people that have requested information on business plans through her office. She stated that she will be speaking at the Rotary luncheon and will be attending the One Stop meeting in Caldwell.

Lillian Pennington stopped in the Commissioners office to inquire as to what happened to two of the puppies that were at the pound as they became property of the Humane Society. She stated that the Humane Society needs a written statement as to what happened to them.

Linda Sheets, Morgan County Office on Aging discussed SAMS and the Farmers Market. She also requested permission to purchase a treadmill and stationary bicycle with her Title 3-D money. The commissioners referred her to speak to the County Auditor.
