

**MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
RIECKER BUILDING**

The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, September 27, 2010 with the following members present:

Mike Reed, President  
Don Reynolds, Vice-President  
Dean Cain, Member

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.  
The minutes of the September 20, 2010 meeting were read and approved.

**10-370** Motion by Mr. Mike Reed and seconded by Mr. Don Reynolds to approve the minutes from September 20, 2010.

**Vote Don Reynolds- yea, Mike Reed- yea, Dean Cain- yea. Motion Carried**

Commissioners approved an application from Morgan Meigsville Water, to bore under County Road 11, located in Meigsville Township, Section No. 27, Morgan County, Ohio for a ¾ inch plastic water line. The Construction of this project will begin on or about October 1, 2010.

Commissioners Reed, Reynolds and Cain signed Proclamations showing support for the “Ohio Children’s Outdoor Bill of Rights”, as submitted by Denise Natoli Brooks, Director of Conservation Education, the Wilds.

The Morgan County Ohio Public Works Sub-Committee meeting was held in the Commissioner’s Office at 9:00am, with the following members present: John McCort, Scott Brown (alternate representative for the Mayors), Dean Cain (Commissioner’s representative), Stevan Hook (County Engineer representative), Don Reynolds (Commissioner), Mike Reed (Commissioner), and Andrea Plummer (Commissioner’s Clerk). The At-Large Committee member was chosen: John McCort. Mr. Hook explained the purpose of the meeting is to assign County priority points to each of the projects (maximum 4) submitted by the Morgan County applicants. Projects were presented and a discussion was held concerning how the points might be distributed. 75 points was awarded to Morgan County Co-op Paving Project #1, 65 points awarded to Morgan County Paving Project #2 and 55 points awarded to McConnelsville Wastewater Treatment Project.

Becky Thompson, Dog Warden, reported traveling 168.9 miles responding to dog calls. Mrs. Thompson stated 8 dogs were impounded, 5 dogs were taken by S.P.O.T., and 2 dogs were redeemed. Commissioners discussed a dog bit with Mrs. Thompson. Becky informed the Commissioners the dog had its tags, rabies shots, and there is no record of the dog biting another child.

Ancil King Jr., Deputy Dog Warden, reported traveling 123.10 miles assisting the Dog Warden. Mr. King stated 3 dogs were euthanized, 5 dogs were impounded, and 2 dogs were redeemed.

**10-371** Motion by Mr. Don Reynolds and seconded by Mr. Dean Cain to amend the following as submitted by Gary Woodward, Auditor:

RESOLUTION THAT THE MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WILL PICK UP THE STATUTORILY REQUIRED CONTRIBUTION TO THE OHIO PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF MORGAN COUNTY PURSUANT TO INTERNAL REVENUE CODE SECTION 414 (h)(2).

WHEREAS, pursuant to federal and Ohio laws, the federal and state income taxes on a portion of the wages or salaries of the employees of Morgan County will be deferred if Morgan County “picks up” (assumes and pays) the contributions statutorily required by such elected officials and covered employees to Ohio Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS); and

WHEREAS, Morgan County will not incur any additional costs in the picking up of such contributions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, THAT:

**SECTION 1:** Effective March 3, 2003, the full amount of the statutorily required employee contributions to OPERS shall be withheld from the gross pay of each person within any of the classes established in Section 2 herein and shall be “picked up” (assumed and paid to OPERS) by Morgan County. This “pick up” by Morgan County shall be designated as public employee contributions as shall be in lieu of contributions to OPERS by each person within any of the classes established in Section 2 herein. No person subject to this “pick up” shall have the option of choosing to receive the statutorily required contribution to OPERS directly instead of having it “picked up” by Morgan County or of being excluded from the “pick up”. Morgan County shall, in reporting and making remittance to OPERS, report that the public employees contribution for each person subject to this “pick up” has been made as provided by the statute. Therefore, contributions, although designated as employee contributions, are employer-paid, and employees do not have the option to receive the contributions directly. All contributions are paid by the employer directly to the plan.

**SECTION 2:** The “pick up” by Morgan County provided by the resolution shall apply to all persons that are employees of Morgan County who are or become contribution members of OPERS:

**SECTION 3:** Morgan County’s method of payment of salary to employees who are participants in OPERS is hereby modified as follows, in order to provide for a salary reduction pick up of employee contributions to OPERS.

**SECTION 4:** The total salary for each employee shall be the salary otherwise payable under Morgan County policies. Such total salary of each employee shall be payable by Morgan County in two parts: (a) deferred salary and (b) cash salary. An employee’s deferred salary shall be equal to that percentage of that employee’s total salary which is required from time to time by OPERS to be paid as an employee contribution by that employee, and shall be paid by Morgan County to OPERS on behalf of that employee as a pick up and in lieu of the OPERS employee contribution otherwise payable by that employee. An employee’s cash salary shall be equal to that employee’s total salary less the amount of the pick up for that employee, and shall be payable, subject to applicable payroll deductions, to that employee. Morgan County shall compute and remit its employer contributions to OPERS based upon an employee’s total salaries payable under applicable Morgan County policies and the pick-up provisions of this resolution shall not be greater than the amounts it would have paid for those items had this provision not been in effect.

**SECTION 5:** The Morgan County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to implement the provisions of this ordinance to institute the “pick up” of the statutorily required contributions to OPERS for those persons reflected in Section 2 herein so as to enable them to obtain the result in federal and state tax deferments.

LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING COMMITTEE (LEPC)  
PROMULGATION

The preservation of life and property is a fundamental responsibility of government at all levels. Chemicals are an essential part of everyday life in Morgan County. The potential for an incident to occur involving the transport, use, storage and/or manufacture of Hazardous Materials (HM) is ever present. Therefore it is an inescapable function of local government to prevent or lessen the impact of such an incident through emergency planning and preparedness.

This plan, the Morgan County's Chemical Emergency Response and Preparedness Plan, establishes the roles, procedures and inter-organizational relationships under which county officials, department heads, and private organizations shall operate in the event of any Hazardous Materials incident(s). It is supported by standard operating procedures that address specific HM concepts.

Thus, the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), nominated by the County Commissioners and appointed by the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC), is charged with the responsibility of preparing, and annually reviewing and exercising the County's Chemical Emergency Response and Preparedness Plan. The plan shall be executed by the Morgan County Commissioners, the County Emergency Management Agency and those Committees and agencies as designated and described within this plan.

This plan supersedes all other Morgan County Hazardous Materials Plans, compliments the Morgan County Emergency Operations Plan, supports the State of Ohio Hazardous Materials Emergency Management Plan, and is coordinated with all neighboring LEPC plans.

This plan is developed in accordance to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 3750 and the rules adopted under it, the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act: Title III -

Emergency Planning and Right-to-Know Act of 1986 (100 Stat. 1729, 42 USCA 11001), and other applicable local, state and/or federal laws.

Shannon Wells, Morgan County Commissioners' Development Office, discussed a balance of \$166,000 for the 2008 CHIP Grant that Washington-Morgan Community Action is administering; these funds must be spent by October 31, 2010. Commissioner Reed stated he spoke with Community Action and they are going to ask for an extension. Mrs. Wells mentioned she spoke with a representative from the Ohio Department of Development and was informed ODOD was not going to grant an extension. Commissioner Reed asked Shannon for the phone number of the representative she spoke with so he could make a telephone call and discuss the matter further. Commissioner Reed asked Shannon if the projects for the 2008 CHIP Grant could be under contract by the October 31<sup>st</sup> deadline but not completed. Mrs. Wells stated her understanding is that the projects must be completed by October 31<sup>st</sup>. Commissioners invited Shannon to attend the meeting this afternoon in the Commissioner's Office with Dawn Rausch, Washington-Morgan Community Action. Mrs. Wells informed Commissioners she held a Contractor's meeting for the 2009 CHIP Grant on Tuesday, September 21<sup>st</sup>; 6 people attended the meeting, since then additional packets have been picked up. Tuesday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, Shannon will hold the first Micro-enterprise class at the library.

Classes will be held every Tuesday and Thursday for the next five weeks. Shannon informed the Commissioners Transit's sign was installed on the front of the building.

Richard Krigbaum inquired on the Neighborhood Stabilization Program. Commissioner Cain instructed Mr. Krigbaum to speak with Shannon Wells, Morgan County Commissioners' Development Office.

Larry Albert questioned Commissioners on dogs not being posted.

Della Bratton telephoned Commissioners and discussed a letter she received from the Secretary of State, Jennifer Brunner's Office concerning the Certificate of Results of Election. The copies of Morgan County Certificate of Results have not been notarized.

Jim Greer, Greer Insurance, Robert Schupette, The Health Plan, and Thurman Harman, Harman Ins. Brokerage, discussed the county's bid for Health Insurance. Also in attendance were: Stevan Hook, Engineer, and Gary Woodward, Auditor. Mr. Greer is not licensed through The Health Plan so he contacted Mr. Harman; however, if this health plan is chosen by the Commissioners, Mr. Greer can remain the county's agent.

Linda Sheets, Office on Aging, discussed accepting the payout of \$1700.00 for damages to one of the Senior Center's vans and putting it towards a new van.

Dawn Rausch, Washington-Morgan Community Action, informed the board Community Action is willing to pay for the Feasibility Study for Solar Panels for the Riecker Building. A site visit will be scheduled soon.

Mike Brown, Spy Glass, inquired if Commissioners had any interest in the program yet. Spy Glass is a Telecommunications Expense Management company. They audit an organization's local, long distance, cell phone and internet billings to help lower expenses. Spy Glass met with Commissioners in August 2008. Commissioner Reed stated he doesn't have a problem with them doing this but noted the county employees' hours have been reduced and workloads increased. It will take some time to gather the required information.
