

**MORGAN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

The Board of the Morgan County Commissioners met in their offices on Monday, July 2, 2012.

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
The minutes of the June 25, 2012 meeting were read and approved.

-Mark Jenkins, Ohio Emergency Management Agency

*This is the first Situation Report for this incident. This report is in response to statewide severe weather on June 29, 2012. The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) Assessment Room was activated at Crises Action Level 1 (CAS-1) ON Friday June 29, 2012 at 5:00p.m. and elevated to CAS-2 at 7:00a.m. (opening Operations Room and Joint Information Center) on Saturday, June 30, 2012.

-An initial CAS-1 briefing was held at 9:00p.m. on June 29, 2012 CAS-2 briefing were held at 10:00 a.m. and at 3:00p.m. today. **The next CAS-2 briefing will be held at 10:00a.m. on Sunday, July 1, 2012.**

-This is the first Situation Report for this incident. The SEOC Assessment Room will be staffed 24 hours through Sunday, July 1, 2012 to monitor the current event.

FATALITIES

A 70 year old female is reported as a confirmed fatality in Muskingum County due to a barn collapse.

INCIDENT SYNOPSIS

-A line of fast-moving severe thunderstorms with powerful winds swept across the state from west to east late in the afternoon on Friday June 29, 2012, leaving widespread damage, downed utility poles and electrical wires, and hundreds of thousands without power. National Weather Service reported winds up to 80 miles per hour during the height of the storm system. There is the potential for scattered storms and systems over the next several days.

-Extreme heat combined with prolonged power outages has created a great concern for Ohio's residents, especially our elderly and medically fragile populations. The State of Emergency Operations Center continues to monitor conditions, and coordinate statewide response, working with state, local and federal partners.

-As of mid-afternoon, approximately 984,206 homes and businesses are without power throughout the state, up 27,291 outages from earlier this morning.

-State-level agencies are responding to eight open missions related debris removal, water/ice, and generators.

WEATHER

Weather Forecast

A few showers and storms are still possible this evening in southern Ohio. There is a slight risk for severe weather tonight. If storms can become severe, damaging winds would be the biggest threat this evening. A few storms are possible along the Ohio River for tomorrow once again with temperatures in the low 90s across the state. There is a better chance for thunderstorms on Monday some of those storms could once again produce some damaging winds gusts. Temperatures will cool slightly by mid to late next week with another chance of storms on the 4th of July.

STATE LEVEL DISASTER ASSISTANCE ACTIONS BY EMERGENCY SUPPORT FUCTIONS (EFS)

ESF – Transportation

Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT)

Debris removal missions continue in areas where power lines are not restricting this action. ODOT currently show 25 closures of secondary routes which can be viewed on www.buckeyetraffic.org Two mission requests are completed today: Union County to provide Detour signs on US 33. The second mission, DMS signs in Richland on IS 71 at SR 97, was canceled as power was restored as crews were mobilizing for the request.

No pending outside agency requests at this time. ODOT will continue to clear on system roadways until all in restored.

ESF-1 has accepted two missions:

- Provide clippers to Lawrence County (District 9)
- Debris removal support in Findlay (District 1)

ESF 2 – Communications

2-1-1 Center

-All 27 regional 211 centers are operational.

-Seventy-six MARCS towers are on generator power. Fuel should last for 2-3 days. There are teams filling tanks; 17 towers are in site trunking due to TI outages. While in site trunking, communications will be limited to local range of the towers.

-Franklin County's BSSA a vehicle provided 12 MARCS radio cache and returned to Columbus. Marion is operating on MARCS and its own system (when it is operating). A talk group, Ecomm-21, is set aside for Marion County to communicate with SECO and general use comm. desk.

Cellular Service

-Verizon reports 5 towers out in the entire state with minimal impact. Locations are unknown.

-Verizon is establishing charging centers in Athens, Defiance, St. Clairsville and Parkersburg, WV.

ESF 3 – Engineering and Public Works

-Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR)

-Power is restored to both Deer Creek and Lake Loramie State Parks. South Eastern ODNR assets still remain without power.

-ODNR Forestry cleared all primitive camping sites. Forestry reports minimal damages.

-It is estimated that the majority of services offered in the state parks facilities will run out soon due to the lack of power. At this point none of the facilities have been identified as critical for life support or health and safety issues.

Ohio Environmental Protection (OEPA)

-Agency personnel from the Public Drinking Water program are in contact with affected facilities to provide advice and technical support to prepare for potential depressurization in case they run out of fuel or the elevated storage tanks run out.

-The city of Athens Public Water System is back in full capacity. Power to the area surrounding the Polk Hollow booster station in Ross County. No report provided on the village of Aberdeen public water system. A mission request has been submitted for generator.

-A few counties have reported some open burning of debris. EPA coordinated with agency PIO on news release for proper disposal through local EMA.

- EMA subject matter experts will coordinate and provide technical support with debris management workgroup.

ESF 4 – Fire

State Fire Marshal’s Office (SFM)

-SFM has reached out through EMA’s and Fire Response Plan partners regarding concerns of water supplies for firefighting. No concerns are reported at this time.

Ohio Department of Aging

ODA has reached out to their local offices and have not received any requests for assistance.

Ohio VOAD

Ohio VOAD is currently delivering a generator to a food bank in Noble County that does not have power and is at risk of losing perishable food items.

Ohio Department of Job and Family Services

ODJFS has indicated that they have limited emergency funding available and would only be able to assist in the hardest impacted areas if assistance was requested.

Ohio Department of Mental Health (ODMH)

The Department of Mental Health Hospital Appalachian Behavioral Healthcare in Athens, Ohio, has a 650 gallon fuel tank capacity for their generator. ODMH has made arrangements with the hospital site in Columbus Twin Valley Behavioral Healthcare to transfer 150 gallons of diesel fuel to ABH for their generator. This is a short term resolution and ODMH will coordinate with DAS for longer termed fuel needs. County ADAMHS Boards (Alcohol Drug Addiction Mental Health Services Boards) have been contacted regarding the incident to alert providers in working with consumers in any local community.

Salvation Army (SA)

SA is currently providing canteen services at the shelter located in Van Wart County.

ESF 8 – Public Health and Medical Services

Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR)

Blue Rock State Park (Muskingum County) in Blue Rock has evacuated all campers and visitors to the facility and is to be considered closed at this point.

ESF 12 – Energy

Public Utilities Commission of Ohio

As a 4:00pm today, utilities report the following outage updates:

Duke has 65,000 customer outages, Restoral time is still estimated to be multi – day, but is expecting better estimates by tonight. AEP has 595,000 homes and businesses without power, with 208,000 of those are in

Columbus area. Restoral estimate is multi – day. DP&L has 85,000 homes and businesses without power. Restoral time is multi – day, but will have a better estimate this evening. All 15 known cooling areas now have power. First Energy (Ohio Edison in Springfield and Mansfield) has a total 18,000 without power: 10,000 in Springfield and 5,000 in Mansfield.

ESF 13 – Law Enforcement

Ohio State Highway Patrol

As a follow-up to an inquiry about 911 center back-ups, OSHP reports each county has a back-up 911 site. There is also a 911 Resolution Center (1-877-888-5622 or 1-888-243-1911), and the OSHP Communications Center available to assist in the District 6 area for emergency situations. OSHP reports some state routes still closed and one oversized load standing by for the power company to remove downed power lines in Champagne County. The Patrol is coordinating with PUCO to get Rural Cooperative repair trucks from PA to OH and WV to assist with power restoration.

ESF 15 – Emergency Public Information External Affairs

Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Four press releases have been issued from the State Joint Information Centers (JIC). In addition a variety of media interviews have been conducted highlighting the efforts of the State Emergency Operations Center. Governor John R. Kasich, General Ashenhurst, Ohio National Guard (ONG) and Nancy Dragani, Ohio EMA, were interviewed today by channel 10TV on the efforts related to the request for an Emergency Declaration and the ONG program to check on the elderly. The JIC is working with ODH, Aging and ONG on talking points that will be used during and in response to the elderly welfare checks. Twitter continues to be the source of both information gathering and dissemination of emerging topics and issues. The Joint Information Center will be activated at 8:00am tomorrow.

OTHER AGENCY REPORTS

Ohio Board of Regents

Two institutions, OSU Newark/COTC and OSU Lima/Rhodes State, both remain closed today. OSU's Don Scott Field airport reports major damage. Damage includes an overturned aircraft, major damage to animal barns at the near by farm operations area, and other damage to hangers and airport operations building. Ohio University reports it was able to provide a 1.5M watt generator at the Athens water treatment plant. The generator is operational and the plant is operating on generator power.

Ohio National Guard

The Ohio National Guard (ONG) is currently working on 2 missions. The wellness mission is being planned in conjunction with the county's EMA's where soldiers will be conducting the checks. The logistical mission is being planned in conjunction with ESF 7 and FEMA's agreement with Defense Supply Center Columbus, (DSCC).
