This past week, the voicemail system connected to the phone switch in the Sheriff's office stopped working. This affected all phone users in the Sheriff's office, County Court, and the Courthouse. To get voicemail functionality restored to all, accounts were created on the Riecker Building's voicemail system and phones were reprogrammed to point towards the Riecker building for voicemail. All voicemail functionality has been restored.

Unfortunately, the voicemail system is old and a new unit cannot be purchased. Several refurbished voicemail systems were found online ranging from \$100 to \$500 (or more). The IT Director will companies selling used/refurbished voicemail units and discuss the options with the Commissioners.

At the direction of the Commissioners, the IT Director finished the course on Professionalism in the Workplace. The course was developed to explain the difference between acceptable and unacceptable workplace behavior, discuss the impact of an employees after work actions, and discuss the impact of social media on the workplace dynamic.

The IT Director uploaded the archived meeting minutes for 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 to the website and updated the webpage accordingly.

With the upcoming purchase of a voicemail system, the IT Director will wait until the end of the year (or early next year) before presenting a list of network items that are needed to support the growing infrastructure.

The IT Director will upload the most recent policy manual to the Commissioners' website and add a link to MoCo Public Transit to the main webpage.
