- -Discussed road issues.
- -The road grader has been out on Bailey Ridge Road and Bald Eagle Road and the roads are a lot better. **18-182-** Motion by Mr. Vanhorn and seconded by Mr. Shriver approve the following:

Whereas, the Morgan County Engineer's Office, McConnelsville Oh (hereinafter referred to as the (Political Subdivision") hereby submits this written agreement to participate in the Ohio Department of Transportation's (ODOT) annual winter road salt bid (018-19)in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code 5513.01 (B) and hereby agrees to all the following terms and conditions in its participation of the ODOT winter road salt contract.

- a) The Political Subdivision hereby agrees to be bound by all terms and conditions established by ODOT in the winter road salt contract and acknowledges that upon the award of the contract by the Director of ODOT it shall be bound by all such terms and conditions included in the contract; and
- b) The Political Subdivision hereby acknowledges that upon the Director of ODOT's signing of the winter road salt contract, it shall effectively form a contract between the awarded salt supplier and the Political Subdivision; and
- c) The Political Subdivision agrees to be solely responsible for resolving all claims or disputes arising out of its participation in the ODOT winter road salt contract and agrees to hold the Department of Transportation harmless for any claims, actions, expenses or other damages arising out of the Political Subdivision participation in the winter road salt contract; and
- d) The Political Subdivision hereby requests through the participation agreement a total of 100tons of Sodium Chloride (Road Salt) of which the Political Subdivision agrees to purchase from its awarded salt supplier at the delivered bid price per ton awarded by the Director of ODOT; and
- e) The Political Subdivision hereby agrees to purchase a minimum of 90% of its above requested salt quantities from its awarded salt supplier during the contract's effective period of September 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019; and
- f) The Political Subdivision hereby agrees to place orders with and directly pay the awarded salt supplier on a net 30 basis for all road salt it receives pursuant to ODOT winter salt contract; and
- g) The Political Subdivision acknowledges that should it wish to rescind this participation agreement it will do so by written, emailed request by no later than Thursday, June 1, 2018. This written, emailed request

to rescind this participation agreement must be received by the ODOT Office of Contract Sales, Purchasing Section email: <a href="mailto:contracts.purchasing@dot.ohio.gov">contracts.purchasing@dot.ohio.gov</a> by the deadline. The Department, upon receipt, will respond that it has received the request and that it has effectively removed the Political Subdivision's participation request. Furthermore, it is the sole responsibility of the Political Subdivision to ensure ODOT has received this responsible or liable for failure to receive a Political Subdivision's participation agreement and/or a Political Subdivision's request to rescind its participation agreement. Now Therefore, be it ordained by the following authorized person(s) that this participation agreement for

the ODOT winter road salt contract is hereby approved, funding has been authorized, and the

## **SECTION I – Project Description**

WHEREAS, the (LPA/STATE) has determined the need for the described project:

Replacement of a single span steel beam bridge over Buck Run of the west branch of Wolf Creek on MRG CR 35-S 4.79 (SFN 5837251). Work includes the elimination of the nearby Y intersection. Total length of work is approximately 0.10 miles.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the **County Board of Commissioners** of **Morgan** County, Ohio.

#### SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the LPA gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project as detailed in the LPA-ODOT-Let Agreement entered into between the parties, if applicable.

# **SECTION III – Cooperation Statement**

The LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the development and construction of the above described project and shall enter into a LPA Federal ODOT Let Project Agreement, if applicable, as well as any other agreements necessary to develop and construct the Project.

The County does hereby propose to assume and contribute the entire cost and expenses of the improvement, less the amount of Federal Aid Funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for financing this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation, and further, the County agrees to bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of the following items:

- 1) Rights-of-Way
- 2) All cost for added construction items generating extra work contracts under Ohio laws, unless performance is approved by the State of Ohio and Federal Highway Administration before work is authorized.

The LPA further agrees to pay 100% of the cost of those features requested by the LPA which are determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration to by unnecessary for the Project.

The LPA further agrees that change orders and extra work contracts required to fulfill the construction contracts shall be processed as needed. The State shall not approve a change order or extra work contract until it first gives notice, in writing, to the LPA. The LPA shall contribute its share of the cost of these items in accordance with other sections herein.

The LPA agrees that if Federal Funds are used to pay the cost of any consultant contract, the LPA shall comply with 23 CFR 172 in the selection of its consultant and administration of the consultant contract. Further the LPA agrees to incorporate ODOT's "Specifications for Consulting Services" as a contract document in all of its consultant contracts. The LPA agrees to require, as a scope of services clause, that all plans prepared by the consultant must conform to ODOT's current design standards and that the consultant shall be responsible for ongoing consultant involvement during the construction phase of the Project. The LPA agrees to include a completion schedule acceptable to ODOT and to assist ODOT in rating the consultant's performance through ODOT's Consultant Evaluation System.

# **SECTION IV Authority to Sign**

The LPA hereby authorizes <u>County Engineer</u> of said <u>Morgan County</u> to enter into and execute contracts with the Director of Transportation which are necessary to develop plans for and to complete the above-described project; and to execute contracts with ODOT pre-qualified consultants for the preliminary engineering phase of the Project.

Upon request of ODOT, the **County Engineer** is also empowered to execute any appropriate documents to affect the assignment of all rights, title, and interests of the **County Board of Commissioners** to ODOT arising from any agreement with its consultant in order to allow ODOT to direct additional or corrective work, recover damages due to errors or omissions, and to exercise all other contractual rights and remedies afforded by law or equity.

#### **SECTION V- Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement**

The LPA agrees that all right-of-way required for the described project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.

The LPA agrees that all utility accommodation, relocation and reimbursement will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFE 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

# **SECTION VI – Maintenance**

Upon completion of the Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the Project in accordance with all applicable State and Federal Law, including, but not limited to, Title 23, U.S.C., Section 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the Project: (3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

# Jeff Babcock, IT Administrator

The IT Director and officers at the Common Pleas Court met with the account and project managers from Equivant regarding issues with the CourtView 3 (CV3) installation at the Courthouse. Having used CV3 for several months now, several problems have surfaced that appear – to the IT Director – to be a result of incomplete training. Equivant took notes on issues from Court officers and is working on a plan to address the problems; likely through addition training.

The first Windows 10 Spring Creator's Updates (1803) hit computers on the County network this week. The upgrade does not take as long to complete as previous Windows 10 Feature Updates, so the IT Director's office will force the upgrade on computers that use CourtView 3 (CV3).

CV3 has some functional problems with the version of Internet Explorer used on Windows 10 Fall Creator's Update (1709). According to Equivant, the company that supports CV3, these problems will be remedied under the Windows 10 Spring Creator's Update.

A new camera was placed over the Riecker Building back door and aimed at the dumpster with the goal of discovering who has been dumping illegally in the Riecker Building's dumpster. The footage will be shared with local law enforcement. Illegal dumping at the Riecker Building has caused the dumpster to be emptied more frequently at greater expense to the County.

TPI, and their hardware installers Velociti, have been working at Public Transit to install the CradlePoint routers in the buses and vans. All SIM cards from Verizon and AT&T were procured prior to installation. There were some initial problems setting up web portal access that stemmed from an existing e-mail issue between HostGator and Roadrunner. However, the software was set up and the installation is underway.
