- Working with contractor regarding mitigation plan update. Collected and submitted more surveys to contractor. Meeting on 11/6. Next meeting December 4th.
- Received notice of approval for supplemental cash request for FY18 EMPG (Emergency Management Performance Grant) in the amount of \$2,152.97 which increased our total FY18 EMPG from \$15,933.00 to \$18,085.97. I executed a supplemental amendment with the State. The supplemental submissions I have made over the past 2 years are what have led to the base increase of our EMPG from \$15,933 to \$21,509.00. (35% increase)
- Working on COOP/COG (Continuity of operations, continuity of government) planning operation. This will be a process which will require each facet of the County government to complete a self-study of a variety of items essential functions, critical resources, interdepartmental/office dependencies, relocation areas, succession of leadership, and communications for just a few. Once the County process is in motion I will encourage adoption by villages and townships.
- Continuing to work on Knowledge Center application training concepts.
- Furnace at 60 S. Fourth failed to heat when turned on. Apperson's contacted and replaced faulty parts.

Election Day came and went with no cybersecurity issues. Election results were posted on the County's website as soon as they were available from Board of Elections.

The list of unresolved phone issues is winding down. A number of miscellaneous issues stemming from buttons not being programmed correctly or being mislabeled were fixed. One remaining problem that the JFS attendant phone is experiencing is caused by people calling the 962-1340 number. During installation, an extension was not set up for 1340; so the calls are just going to the JFS operator extension. Once corrected, JFS will no longer have to field these calls.

The new file server for the Engineer's office arrived this week and was placed online. Bruce Harris Associates came to discuss data migration and remote access to the new server.

Maintenance in the Riecker Building is concerned about leaks and potential dry rot on the roof of the old portion of the building. Investigations are on-going.
