Aggregate

Five (4) companies submitted bids on thirteen (13) different aggregate materials (See attached list).

Shelly Materials Company was low bidder on the gravel products. Although we do not use a whole lot on gravel this will be our location to purchase any gravel products

The four companies submitted bids on the crushed stone portion of the bid request. When trucking costs are brought into the equation Sergeant Stone has the best overall delivered costs when "good" stone is required west of McConnelsville. If good stone is not a controlling requirement Cumberland Limestone has the best value.

Since job location, haulage costs, and job aggregate requirements will vary on a daily basis; it is my recommendation that all the bids be accepted and usage will be based upon location and job requirements to obtain the most overall cost effective results for the materials and transportation to a given location.

- The issue causing the Internet slowness in the Riecker Building has been found and corrected. After testing the connection through the firewall and at the modem, it was discovered that the firewall was slowing the upload speed to the Internet in the Riecker Building. After going through the firewall's settings page by page, it was discovered that the quality of service (QoS)

was turned on and set to the old Internet connection's speeds. Once QoS was turned off, speed tests ran at 100 - 110 Mbps download and 10 - 12 Mbps upload. QoS was initially used to allow video teleconference software priority connection to the Internet, but is no longer needed.

While troubleshooting the Internet slowness with Spectrum, it was revealed that Spectrum doubled the download speed for the services in our area. So, our base service should be 200 Mbps download and 10 Mbps upload. Unfortunately, speed tests still show that our download speed is about 100 Mbps. Troubleshooting is ongoing with the new speeds as well as Internet slowness issues at the Sheriff's Office and Courthouse.

Advanced Business Communications returned and installed shelves for the backup batteries of the phone system at the Riecker Building. This officially completes the installation of the new phone system in the Riecker Building, Sheriff's Office, and Courthouse.
