The IT Director was added to the County's web domain registrar, DotGov.gov, to manage technical aspects of the domain and account.

Denial of service/distributed denial of service (DoS/DDoS) protection was added to the County's website via Cloudflare's Athenian Project. The premise is that Cloudflare will host the name servers for the County's website instead of the actual hosting site, HostGator. In the event of a DDoS attack, Cloudflare will take aggressive measure to blacklist IP addresses involved in the attack so that the website will remain available to legitimate requests.

The ArcGIS license manager was moved from the Engineer's old server to their new server. Several firewall modifications were required on the new server to allow access to the license manager from the ArcGIS Desktop program on each workstation.

The Health Department's Infall computer was rebuilt by DJH Computers. The computer was returned to the Health Department and the Infall program was reinstalled by Primary Solutions.

The wiring for the ballot computers was finished in the Board of Elections office. Poynters returned to add the computers to the proper subnet on the switch.
