#### RESOLUTION TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION – RC Sections, 5705.222, 5705.25, RC Chapter 5126

Mr. Shriver moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MORGAN COUNTY, OHIO, that,

WHEREAS, it is the determination of the Board of Morgan County Commissioners that the amount of tax within the ten mill limitation of levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide the necessary requirements for the purpose of <u>the operation of community programs and</u> services authorized by county boards of developmental disabilities, for the acquisition, contruction, renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of intellectual disabilities and developmental disabilities facilities, or for both of such purposes, to levey a renewal tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation in the amount of 1.97 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.197 for each hundred dollars of valuation for a continuing period of time; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provision of R.C. 5705.222, R.C. 5705.25, The Board of Commissioners, Morgan County, Ohio, hereby declare it necessary to levy a tax in excess of such limitation <u>for the purpose of the operation of community programs and services authorized by county boards of developmental disabilities, for the acquisition, contruction, renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of intellectual disabilities and developmental disabilities facilities, or for both of such purposes, to levey a renewal tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation in the amount of 1.97 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.197 for each hundred dollars of valuation for a continuing period of time, and to submit to the electors said tax levy.</u>

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such levy shall be at a rate not to exceed ( 1.97 ) mills for each one dollar of tax valuation which amounts to cents (0. 197 ) for each hundred dollars of tax valuation for a period of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ five \_\_\_\_\_ ( 5 ) years commencing with the tax year

<u>2021</u> for the purpose of <u>the operation of community programs and services authorized by</u> <u>county boards of developmental disabilities</u>, for the acquisition, contruction, renovation, financing, <u>maintenance</u>, and operation of intellectual disabilities and developmental disabilities facilities, or for <u>both of such purposes</u>, to levey a renewal tax in excess of the ten-mill limitaion in the amount of 1.97 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.197 for each hundred dollars of valuation for a continuing period of time.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Morgan County, Ohio be and is hereby directed to submit the issue of said tax levy to the electors of Morgan County, Ohio at the election to be held on <u>November 3, 2020</u>, said date being the first Tuesday after the first Monday in <u>November 2020</u> as a <u>renewal</u> levy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of Morgan County, is hereby directed to immeditely certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections of Morgan County, Ohio prior to the date of \_\_\_\_\_\_ July 27, 2020

## Jeff Babcock, It Administrator

-There was a huge increase in the amount of spam e-mail received by County users this past week. The e-mails appear to come from actual County users, but the e-mail addresses are not from the County's mail domain. Addresses originating from outside the United States are being blocked on the County's mail server. County officers were shown what to look for on spam emails and advised to report domain names to the IT Director.

There was a power surge and/or outage on the morning of 22 July 2020. It appears the Riecker Building may have suffered another lightning strike. All AC units were offline at the opening of business as well as the elevator and basement sewage pump. The Auditor's office server was offline as well. The Engineer's office had several computers that were reporting a power surge and needed to be manually reset. All equipment was restored to operation, though the IT Director missed the monthly Zanesville – Muskingum Safety Council meeting as a result.

Morgan County Court was able to use their new video teleconferencing equipment to connect with the Regional Jail in Nelsonville. Initially, the connection was not working, but it was discovered that the bandwidth setting for video calls from County Court was set too high. Once the settings were modified, the video conference was able to be conducted without any issues.

Following a Windows 10 update, the installed version of Microsoft Office on the

Commissioners' Clerk's PC (MS Office 2007) as started to behave abnormally. Workarounds have been discovered for all issues at this time, but it is advised that the Commissioners' Clerk get a new PC. In addition to the issues with MS Office, the PC is running out of hard drive space for files that need to be retained for permanent record.
