- The BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE MORGAN COUNTY LEARNING CENTER, INCORPORATED (MCLC) voted unanimously to cease operations of the MCLC, and to dissolve the non-profit corporation known as the Morgan County Learning Center, Inc.
- 2. The corporation will be dissolved according to state and federal laws.
- 3. Any assets will be offered to Morgan County governmental units, offices and departments (Board of Health, Morgan County Transit, Job and Family Services, etc.)
- 4. Any assets belonging to Mid-East Career and Technology Center will be returned.
- 5. Any remaining assets will be disposed of through an online auction service (GOVERNMENTLIQUIDATORS.COM).
- 6. Any cash will be used to continue offering GED classes through the Morgan County Department of Job and Family Services (DJFS). As such, said cash will be transferred to DJFS via the Morgan County Auditor's Office.
