Shannon Wells submitted a \$1 million grant for Brownfield revitalization for the Morgan County Land Reutilization Corporation on December 5, 2025. The projects included 5044 N. SR60 assessment, Parmiter Rd landfill additional assessment, 1800 SR 377 additional water sampling and assessment for 640 Main St. Malta.

Shannon Wells submitted TAP grants for the Village of McConnellsville to ODOT. One for a multi-use path from the roundabout to village limits on SR60 for \$605,625. The second one for a roundabout in the Village of McConnellsville for \$2,638,069.46.

Shannon Wells submitted a pre-application for a Vibrant Communities project for the Stanberry building for Citizens National Bank for \$1 million.

Contract Renewal Discussion

- The contract term was reviewed, with a preference to remove the automatic renewal clause.

Staffing and Recruitment Challenges

- The department is struggling to recruit and retain providers due to non-competitive wages.
- A recent EMT candidate declined the offer because the pay—despite a 4% increase—was lower than her current certified nursing assistant wage.

- The department must cover EMT training costs, approximately \$14,000 for a medic course.
- Many new recruits prefer fire service over EMS. The department currently has four EMT volunteers, with only two consistently active.
- Concern was expressed about potentially failing to meet the minimum staffing requirement of four personnel as stipulated by the contract.

Stand-by Calls and Resource Management

- Requests for squads to remain “stand-by” on scenes have increased, tying up resources for extended periods.
- One incident involved a squad waiting six hours for a lost person who was not injured, keeping a unit far from its primary service area.
- Another incident involved a delayed squad request after a missing person was already found.

Review of Jail Renovation Plans and Cost Increases

- A meeting was held last week where Commissioner Mayle learned about additional funding and project costs.
- The project cost has increased from the initial \$2 million. One figure mentioned was \$2.5 million, which includes new windows for the first floor.

- The price increase is partly due to adding another holding cell. The original design was reconfigured to accommodate this change.

Discussion on New Holding Cell Design

- Reviewed the electronic document showing the new layout. The design now includes three two-person cells and a separate bottom cell, potentially for female inmates.
- This configuration allows holding up to eight people if no females are present.
- A question was raised about whether these are holding cells or full cells, as the design appears to be full cells. Holding cells have different requirements.
- It was suggested that costs could be reduced by making the space a single large holding cell and removing a toilet, given the 12-to-1 inmate-to-toilet ratio.

Security and Access Control in the New Layout

- The discussion covered security features for the dispatch and control room. A vestibule with interlocked doors was suggested for the control room entrance to prevent unauthorized jail access.
- There was concern about a public corridor providing access near the control room.
- It was suggested to check if a specific door could be removed to enhance security without violating fire codes.

Jeff Babcock, IT Administrator

The first PC using Microsoft Entra ID was set up this week. Entra ID is included with the County's Microsoft 365 Business Basic plan and should satisfy the requirement for identity management from the State Auditor's office and CORSA, the County's insurance provider. As additional security requirements are put into place by the County's cybersecurity policy, Entra ID should be able to automatically apply these requirements to all connected computers.

The Courthouse elevator phone, which had failed during an inspection by the State Elevator Inspector, was apparently working all along. It appears that the call button needs to be held down for at least one second to initiate a 911 call. Simply pressing and releasing the button

quickly is not sufficient. A technician from Otis said that this was not a bug, but a feature that prevents accidental calls to 911 in the event someone brushes against the button.

A Wifi access point was moved in the basement of the Courthouse to allow better connectivity to the security officer's laptop by the door. While connectivity did improve, it was not ideal for real-time viewing of the cameras. To fix this issue, a hard line was run from the security desk to the network rack with the camera NVR.

The receive email address for voicemail was updated on all phone systems that support the voicemail to email feature. Previously, voicemails were sent to the old email domain, morgancounty-oh.gov.

Re: Fuel Bid Results to County Highway Garage

Only one vender (Greuey's Fuel and Farm Supply, LLC), submitted a bid for supplying Regular Unleaded Gasoline and Ultra-Low-Sulfur #2 Diesel Fuel under three option rates. Those options are:

- 1.) Delivery to the County Highway Department only.
- 2.) Delivery to all other tanks.
- 3.) Providing fuel pump service for individual vehicles.

The results are as follows:

OPTION #1 – Delivery to County Highway Garage

The diesel bids are based upon the “UBD (Unbranded) Rack Average Price” at the Marietta terminal “Oil Price Information Service” (OPIS) for the date of November 26, 2025 for Ultra Low Sulfur Diesel with an average rack price of \$2.14 per gal., plus \$0.47 for State tax, plus delivery charges. Fuel will be delivered for \$2.799 per gal to the customer’s tank or designated location. This creates a delivery cost of \$0.180 per gal., \$2.799 - \$2.61=\$0.180, a \$0.189 increase for 2026.

The gasoline bids are based upon the “Average Rack Price” at the Marietta terminal “Oil Price Information Service” (OPIS) for the date of November 26, 2025 for Ethanol (10%) gasoline with an average rack price of \$1.648 per gal. Plus \$0.385 for state tax which equals \$2.033. Fuel will be delivered for \$2.222 per gal to the customer’s tank or designated location. This creates a delivery cost of \$2.222 - \$2.033=\$0.189 per gal., an increase of \$0.035/gal.

OPTION #2 – Delivery to Townships

The diesel bids are based upon the “Average Rack Price” at the Marietta terminal “Oil Price Information Service” (OPIS) for the date of November 26, 2025 for Ultra Low Sulfur Diesel with an average rack price of **\$2.14 per gal. Plus federal fuel tax .5047/ gal. Fuel will be delivered for \$2.899 per gal** to the customer’s tank, designated location, or pump in Malta. **This creates a delivery cost of \$0.289 per gal., a Decrease of \$0.005/gal**

The gasoline bids are based upon the “Average Rack Price” at the Marietta terminal “Oil Price Information Service” (OPIS) for the date of February 25, 2025 for Ethanol (10%) gasoline with an average rack price of **\$1.648 per gal. Plus \$0.385 state fuel tax. Fuel will be delivered for \$2.242 per gal** to the customer’s tank or designated location. **This creates a delivery cost of \$0.209 per gal., an increase of \$0.005/gal.**

The gasoline bids are based upon the “Average Rack Price” at the Marietta terminal “Oil Price Information Service” (OPIS) for the date of November 26, 2025 for Ethanol (10%) gasoline with an average rack price of **\$1.648 per gal. Plus state tax of \$0.385. Fuel will be delivered for \$2.332 per gal** to the County’s pump at Greuey’s Fueling station. **This creates a delivery cost of \$0.299 per gal.**



1. The only way to decrease delivery costs would be install a system that could handle bulk deliveries, meaning we would need a tank system that could hold at least 8,000 gallons. In today's regulatory realities; it is most likely not economical. This would require a separate detailed study itself.
2. Therefore since we do not have the ability to receive tanker bulk deliveries of diesel fuel or gasoline; I see no reason to not accept this proposal.

However, I think we should let each of the Townships individually decide if they are willing to accept this quote.

This is a \$2119.38 increase from 2025 Prices, however; we did change some of the tire needs and quality on this bid sheet for 2026.

Central Ohio Tire LLC will also be mounting about 40 dump truck tires in their shop at no additional cost to us and their hourly prices remained the same as 2025 with no increase.



