Environmental Health Technician

The Morgan County General Health District is actively seeking a qualified candidate for the part-time contract position of Environmental Health (EH) Technician. Under direction of the Health Commissioner/Administrator and supervision of the Environmental Health Director, the candidate chosen for this position will conduct inspections on Sewage Treatment Systems (STS); Vector Control and Surveillance Activities; Real Estate private water sampling & laboratory submission and follow-up; Animal Bite Investigation follow-up; EH Division Administrative Support Assistance; EH program data entry and management assistance; and other duties as assigned.

- 1. Conducts intermittent and follow-up STS inspections and Nuisance Complaint inspections using a camera and checklist for further Environmental Health Director review. These activities can include measuring distances, dye testing, and lifting septic tank lids.
- 2. Under supervision of the Environmental Health Director, consults with Real Estate agents regarding archived STS files of record; obtains water samples for pending property transfers; and submits lab results and Real Estate STS inspections to Environmental Health Director for final approval/disapproval.
- 3. Participates in Vector control/surveillance activities.
- 4. Under supervision of the Environmental Health Director, follows-up on Animal bite reports and coordinates specimen collection/submission via a Courier to ODH lab.
- 5. Assistance with the Administrative Support position to include file reviews for completeness. Further assists with data management activities including plumbing back flow program.
- 6. Prepares and maintains Real Estate and Nuisance Complaint inspection reports and all supporting documentation.
- 7. Demonstrates regular and predictable attendance.
- 8. Meets all job safety requirements and all applicable OSHA safety standards that pertain to essential functions.

Other Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Responds to public health emergencies as directed by the Board, Health Commissioner, and Administrator.
- 2. Performs other duties as required.

Qualified candidates must possess:

High School Diploma or GED with College degree preferred; a valid Ohio driver's license; access to a personal vehicle; and proof of insurance. All applicants must be computer literate, proficient with Microsoft Word & Excel, and able to effectively communicate orally and in writing.
